

Discover the natural beauty of the Boyne Valley, where the valley floor is rich with wetland vegetation typical of prairie marshes. As you walk the scenic trail, you'll see cattails, reed grass, sedges, and white top grass. Look for willows along the water's edge, a stand of bur oak on the eastern slopes, and trembling aspen throughout the area.

The Boyne Valley is home to many of southern Manitoba's animal species. You might spot white-tailed deer, mink, raccoons, beavers, muskrats, and rabbits. Birdwatchers can enjoy seeing great blue herons, wood ducks, mallards, and both red-winged and yellow-headed blackbirds. Experience the diverse wildlife and serene landscapes that make the Boyne Valley a perfect destination for nature lovers.

Treherne Pathways Project

Goals of the Project:

- To provide active living enthusiasts with a walking route that will highlight community attractions;
- To develop an interpretive trail in the Boyne Valley to provide area residents, students and tourists an opportunity to attain a better understanding of natural marsh and prairie habitat.

The project consists of a 2.5 km pathway in the town of Treherne and a 1.5 km nature trail in the Boyne Valley on the east side of Treherne between Hwy #2 and the former CPR line. The town trail utilizes existing sidewalks while the nature trail includes grass, crushed stone and boardwalk surfaces. Two 80 ft. bridges, one covered, cross the Boyne Valley.

The Boyne Valley Nature Trails are located on land owned by John and Evelyn Green and Family and Timmerman Enterprises. The Boyne Valley Trails Committee wishes to acknowledge them for their co-operation and long term commitment to the project.

We also acknowledge the lands of the Boyne Valley Nature Trail as original ancestral lands, part of the Treaty 1 territory. We recognize all who have provided stewardship of these lands over the years.
